New business	Natalia Hildner	 RCC center works within Dane County to promote hope, help and healing for those harmed by sexual violence and strives through education & outreach to create social change to end sexual violence Difference between RCC and UNIDOS, UNIDOS focuses strictly on Latino community RCC are a direct outcome of the feminist movement of the 70s; neutral medium between institutions (police, hospitals, etc); exist in majority of counties; advocate for survivors Crisis line 608-251-7273 608-258-2567 (Spanish) Direct services = 2500 calls per year; work directly with survivor, medical and legal accompaniments; can't give legal advice, but able to give referrals Education & outreach = Presentation and training; educate worksites/companies & high schools Youth advocacy Misconceptions about who has been victims by media = white women assaulted by a man of color Usually, the race of the victim and perpetrator are the same; we must be cognizant of the racism We live in a rape culture = we live in an environment where these things are normalized We must change these social norms Wide range of sexual violence = sexual exploitation, sexual abuse, sex assault/rape, sex harassment, stalking, indecent exposure, etc. Service to the Latino community = Latinx states □Latinx services□Collaborations and Campaigns In 2010, sexual assaults among Latino women = only 3.3% report/utilize victim services Connected with Planned Parenthood—sponsors Latino community members to pay them to have a learning party in their home to educate about sex education (at least 10 people), and there will be more info on sexual assault too!
