- COVID Updates
 - COVID Education
 - LatinX Community Vaccination Rates (Shiva)
 - Huge amount of work on COVID Vaccine Access for the last 2 years
 - Lourdes Shanjani and PHMDC, Dr. Tellez Giron and Students have been amazing collaborators
 - Dane County:
 - 78.2% of Latinx community has had 1 dose (higher than overall at 76%)
 - Over 90% of those eligible to receive the vaccine have received 1 dose
 - Need work on Boosters lagging a bit: 38% of eligible to receive booster have received booster in Latinx community.

- Hospitalizations: very high. ~100 today
- We seem to have reached a peak with Omicron
- Wear mask, social distance, don't engage in activities that aren't necessary in person.
- In general: Wear masks, vaccines work! Don't lower your guard with COVID.
- Debunk the myth of vaccine hesitancy when things are done in a community informed way. LHC's work has really showed that access and being community centered makes a huge difference.
